Dear Parents

We have had a busy couple of weeks in school. The Year 5 & 6 Hockey Tournament two weeks ago at both Marsh Gibbon School and here was a great success. Four schools took part with Marsh Gibbon hosting the Year 5 competition and Year 6's remaining here. We plan to repeat this interschool sports partnership with Year 3 and 4 after half term.

All the teachers will be here, covering different areas of literacy, mathematics, phonics, Early Years and Growth Mindset. It is an interactive session which is organised on a carousel basis to allow you to visit each session. This will also be an opportunity for you to speak to the teachers to understand areas which have concerned you or you are unsure of. The teachers will be able to explain how your children are learning, including the methods that they are using. Do remember that if ever you have any concerns about your child's learning or homework please come and speak to us so we can clarify any queries or misconceptions you may have.

I hope the children have enjoyed our Spiritual, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural week. Each teacher has focussed on one of these four areas and has moved to each class of children to inspire them each day. It has been lovely to see the debates and thought provoking activities which have been happening across the school.

Foundation had a fabulous trip to the Buckinghamshire Railway Centre at Quanton on Wednesday. They had a trip on a steam train and model railway and learnt about the trains. All came back happy but exhausted from a great day out.

It was good to see everyone at our parent's evening this week. I had lots of comments from parents about how happy their children are in their new classes which is wonderful to hear.

NOROVIRUS

Each year the run up to Christmas sees an increase in the number of children falling ill. Norovirus, also known as Winter Vomiting Bug, is the most common stomach bug in the UK. Symptoms include sickness and diarrhoea and can be accompanied by fever and headaches.

NHS choices have information on their website at <http://www.nhs.uk/Conditions/Norovirus/Pages/Introduction.aspx> with advice on treating the symptoms.

To help reduce the spread of the illness children should remain away from school until 48 hours after their last symptoms.

Diarrhoea and vomiting in children

There's no specific cure for stomach bugs such as **Norovirus**. See tips to reduce the spread and treat symptoms

- Give kids plenty of water to stay hydrated and replace lost fluids
- If your child feels like eating, give them bland foods




