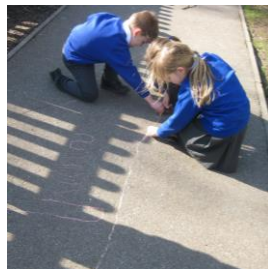

Dear Parents

What a fantastic day we had at the Royal Albert Hall last Monday. Miss Chilton, myself, ten Key Stage 2 girls and some Mums all travelled by train into London and onto the Royal Albert Hall. Mums went off to enjoy their day in London and we rehearsed our songs in the impressive atmosphere that is the Royal Albert Hall. We had two hours to ourselves in the afternoon so left the hall to enjoy lunch with the children. We then returned for the evening performance. It was amazing, 52 schools, 1800 children all singing and playing with enthusiasm and passion. The sound was fantastic and so exciting to be part of such an experience in one of our most iconic venues. Thank you to the children for a wonderful day and to all the parents who came with us or came to support their children in the evening. Miss Chilton and I were very proud of the children, it was a pleasure to take them and to be part of such a memorable experience for them.

Regarding school visits, the recent events at Westminster, which saw several school parties kept at the Palace of Westminster whilst the building was in lockdown, reiterate the importance of having up to date contact information for us to be able to reach you. We have robust procedures and risk assessments in place for every school visit and these include the teacher in charge having a list of contact numbers for all parents of the children on the trip. For out of school hours visits we also access to the SMS text messaging service so we can keep you informed. If you change your number please let us know as soon as possible and please save the school number into your mobile phone so you can reach us if you need to. If you haven't received a text message in the last month can you please let us know so that we can check that we have the right number registered with the service.

In the changing landscape of education in this country the Governors felt that we should take the opportunity to investigate local Multi Academy Trusts (MAT) as an alternative to the Local Authority model of school management. A working party was set up with the aim of looking at MAT provision and how this might benefit our school. The challenges of this are far reaching and we will be informing you of the outcome of the Governors review in due course.

On Thursday Miss Leslie took six children to the Guttman Centre to train to be playleaders. They had a great day learning games and strategies to help them support children's play at lunchtime. The children were fantastic and we look forward to seeing them put their new skills into practise. We would also like to thank the parents for transporting the children. On this note we would like to thank all parents who help transport children to various sporting or other activities. Without them we would not be able to do all the activities we do as the price of a coach would prohibit being able to travel to venues, so a massive thank you.

The PTFA Quiz Night, last Saturday, was a great success. Thank you to Richard Wade for the quiz itself, I believe it was suitable taxing! Thank you to all the PTFA for organising and ensuring the night went well and to Lisa Machay for the food. Well done to the staff team who upheld our standards from last time and came first! Well done and thank you to everyone who took part.



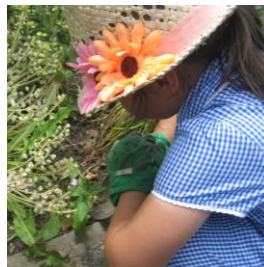
