## Dear Parents

The children and staff have really felt the heat this week. We have tried to keep everyone out of the sun as much as possible, using the front area at lunchtimes. Running around has been curtailed and the children are constantly being reminded to drink plenty of water. Lovely as it is to have such beautiful weather we are fully aware of the need to ensure the children are protected from overheating. Please could you ensure that they have plenty of sun cream on each day whilst this weather lasts and sun hats are a must.

Once again we have had a lot of children from KS2 without one or more items in their PE Kit. Although we do have a few items that children are able to borrow this cannot be relied upon as every child should have a PE kit, including trainers, in school every day. To help motivate your children to remember their kit in future, and encourage their independence, we will be taking Golden Time away from your child if they don't have their PE kit in school.

I hope those parents who came to the Transfer Test (11+) evening found it useful and explained the process clearly. The powerpoint has been sent home to you to enable you to check anything you were unsure of. If you would like to discuss anything further please come and speak to me.

We have been really fortunate in having the opportunity to work with the Roald Dahl Museum in Great Missenden. Miss Leslie has attended several meetings there and helped to design the programme of study that children will experience when they visit the museum. In return for her hard work, Year 5 and 6 had a workshop with a visitor from the museum last week and Year 3 and 4 will visit the museum to experience some of the projects that Miss Leslie has been advising on. We hope to continue this relationship and build on it in the future.

Many thanks to Serraina Chappell for coming into school to talk to, first the Reception children and then Year 5 & 6, about her faith as a Muslim. As a Christian school it is important to teach children about all faiths and ensure that they understand and respect all religions. The children asked some really interesting questions and we are very fortunate to be able to welcome a visitor in school willing to share their experience.

Year 3 and 4 had a brilliant time at the Inter-school Rounders Tournament on Wednesday. All the visiting schools remarked on how welcome they had been made. The children enjoyed their Rounders and the quiz that they did whilst not competing. Edwin and Erin were awarded medals for good sportsmanship. These inter-school competitions have been very successful and we hope to continue these in the new school year.



## Bags of Help

Great News! Our application to the Tesco Bags of Help Grant Scheme to help finance the

makeover of the School Garden has been successful, and it will be put forward to the customer vote from July 1<sup>st</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup> August 2017.

Our project, along with the other two successful projects in our region will go forward to a vote in the Tesco Stores in Buckingham where customers can decide the outcome by voting for their favourite project each time they shop. Tesco teamed up with Groundwork to launch its community funding scheme, which sees grants of £4000, £2000 and £1000 - all raised from the 5p levy - being awarded to local community projects.
