The information about applying for your child's Reception class place for September 2018 has been distributed by Buckinghamshire County Council and is also available via their website www.bucksc.gov.uk.

The important dates for the process are as follows:

6 Nov 2017 From this date you can make your primary school application (Buckinghamshire residents only).

DEADLINE!

12 Jan 2018 This is the latest date for returning a paper application to your child's current infant school if you are making an application to transfer to junior school.

DEADLINE!

15 Jan 2018 This is the latest date to submit your online application (Buckinghamshire residents only), you have until 3pm. If you are posting your application it must reach us by 3pm on this date.

DEADLINE!

29 Jan 2018 The latest date for moving into or within Buckinghamshire (and providing evidence that you are resident) for us to use this address for the first round of allocations. Final date for agreed special cases to be considered as timely (moving house is not considered to be a special case).

16 Apr 2018 If you applied online you can login to see which school we have offered your child. You will also get an email.

Does your family qualify?

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 in state-funded schools in England are eligible for free school meals.

From Year 3 onwards, if your family receives one or more of the following, your son or daughter may be eligible for free school meals:

- Income Support
- Income based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income based Employment and Support Allowance
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child tax credit and no working tax credit with an income of less than £16,190
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

NOROVIRUS

Diarrhoea and vomiting in children

There's no specific cure for stomach bugs such as **Norovirus**. See tips to reduce the spread and treat symptoms

Keep kids home from school for

48 HOURS

after symptoms have passed. This is enough time to let the virus run its course

Washing hands frequently and thoroughly helps limit the spread of the virus

25 different strains of Norovirus are known to affect humans. They're the most common cause of stomach bugs in the UK

Home Treatment

Paracetamol is useful for fever or aches and pains

Give kids plenty of water to stay hydrated and replace lost fluids

If your child feels like eating, give them bland foods


Each year the run up to Christmas sees an increase in the number of children falling ill. Norovirus, also known as Winter Vomiting Bug, is the most common stomach bug in the UK. Symptoms include sickness and diarrhoea and can be accompanied by fever and headaches.

NHS choices have information on their website at <http://www.nhs.uk/Conditions/Norovirus/Pages/Introduction.aspx> with advice on treating the symptoms.

To help reduce the spread of the illness children should remain away from school until 48 hours after their last symptoms.

COFFEE MORNING - Friday 1st December - 9.00am



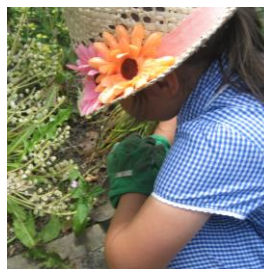
Everyone is welcome to come along for a catch up, a cuppa and a slice of cake. Younger siblings are very welcome too and we provide toys to entertain them.
