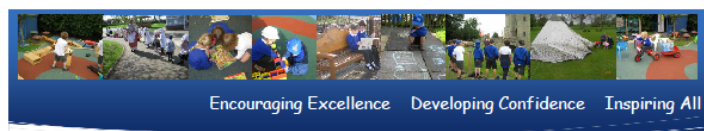

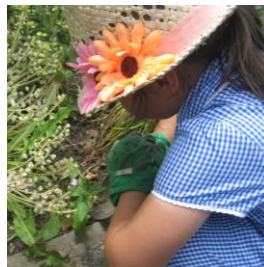
### NEARLY NEW UNIFORM
