Governors Update - March 2015

The Governing Body has been undergoing quite a few changes in recent months, not only have the Governors who joined us in 2013 been finding their feet (Jules Dixon & Charlie Wood - with Avril Jones having left us at the end of last summer). But also Governors new to this academic year have been getting involved, with Andrea Hodges (Foundation), Katie Glass (Parent) and Sarah O'Brien (Staff) joining last October and Charlotte Gurney (Associate) from February. This has meant increased workloads for the more experienced Governors as well as the Chair & Head Teacher, but all requirements have been covered without concern, the school nicely increasing in numbers to now around the 100 mark.

Regretfully for us, in February. Robert Boughton, after 16 years of exemplary service to the school governing body decided to stand down. Robert has seen the school through from a very unhealthy roll call of about 25 to the present day position and has decided that having helped to get the school to its current healthy state it was a good time to step down from his position as Foundation Governor. Obviously it is very sad to see him go but we thank him so very much for all his hard work.

Therefore at present the four key Committees within the Governing Body - Welfare, Curriculum, Finance & Personnel & PR & Strategy are in a state of flux whilst the new Governors settle into their positions and it is fully decided where everyone's experience and skills best fit.

In the next month or so Governors will be going on two significant group training sessions, one for Special Needs (SEND) and the other to give us advice on the new OFSTED requirements to prepare us for the future.

Obviously there has also been a great deal of activity in school which the Governors have also been supporting:-

- The new build completion with just the Conservatory and outside classroom to be re-erected.
- The new Year 5 influx (& Year 6 ready for September).
- The new National Curriculum and making sure it is embedded appropriately within the school.
- The ongoing challenge of managing a financial budget constraints.

This being in addition to all the normal activities that the Governors need to monitor such as Health & Safety, Policy updates, School Development Plan, Pupil Progress and Performance etc. to name a few.

There has been significant focus in supporting The Headteacher and teaching staff with regard to recruitment this term, ensuring that the school was able to meet the needs of the school with additional teaching expertise on very tight timelines for the summer term but also then into September and beyond for the next academic year. Such recruitment has also had an impact on budget planning. Consequently the Finance committee met on the 24th March to review the new budget for next year and any implications to ensure we are fully and adequately provided for.

As you may be aware, there has also been a consultation by County to clarify the local catchment areas, particularly affecting Twyford, Marsh Gibbon and Grendon Schools. We support the recommendations and these will hopefully be adopted thereby clarifying all historical confusion regarding the schools on this subject as well as any school transport issues.

The Spring Governing Body meeting was held on Tuesday evening 10th February and covered a lot of the aspects already mentioned, in addition the SEND policy review was discussed as well as the Headteachers report and the School Development Plan and self-evaluation. All the previous committee minutes and any points arising that needed to be reviewed at the full meeting discussed. Particular time was spent around the recruitment challenges and the budget status and impacts.

The School Governors are there to not only help and support the School and staff but also its Pupils and Parents. Each Governor is affiliated with a year group and would welcome parents input or questions on any aspect of School life.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Following some concerns from parents about the school jumpers for our Year 5 and 6 children we are currently trialling two different 100% acrylic jumpers. Our testers are wearing, washing and tumble drying the jumpers to see how they cope with the demands of school life in our Upper Key Stage 2 class and we will let you know a decision on these as soon as possible. The cost of both of these jumpers is slightly less than the current cotton mix jumper.

Our uniform suppliers have also advised us that they will be increasing the cost for all the uniform. We are negotiating with them to try and keep these increases to a minimum without affecting the quality of the items they supply. The increases will take effect from September 2015.

We have looked at the costs from other suppliers and believe that we are still getting good value for money, particularly as they are willing to continue to supply small numbers of items at a time and provide a high level of service.

CHILDCARE VOUCHERS
