Apologies for the disruption last Friday with the snow. I need to update you on the status of our joining the MAT (Multi Academy Trust). At present it is on hold whilst we ensure that it is definitely the best thing for our school and our children. Financially as well as academically, this has to be a decision which will benefit our children. At present we will not be making a decision until at least the summer allowing the new head teacher to gain an understanding of what everything entails. The governors will then review the situation and make the final decision in the Autumn term.

I know Years 5 & 6 are looking forward to their residential next week. I am sure they will have a great time and I look forward to hearing all about it on their return. Parents will be kept up to date with texts throughout the week.
