Dear Parents/Carers,

So many children have arrived in school today wearing red, white and blue to help celebrate the Royal Wedding of Prince Harry and Meghan Markle. The children are spending the day working on 'Royal Wedding' themed activities and will share their work with the rest of the school this afternoon - I am looking forward to seeing what they have been doing.

Years 3 & 4 had a wonderful time yesterday on their trip to the Verulamium Museum in St Albans, where they were immersed in Roman life for the day. Upon return to school the children were very keen to tell me about their experiences - one even said "it was the best trip ever!"

I am very proud of the children in Year 6 this week as they undertook the statutory end of KS2 SATs testing. They have all worked extremely hard, not only during this week, but in the time leading up to these assessments. The learning attitudes they showed of perseverance and determination were excellent - well done Year 6!

I am delighted to inform you that the school has successfully been awarded the Silver Quality Assurance Mark for Science (PSQL). This is the result of a lot of hard work to increase the profile and quality of science teaching in the school. You can continue to help strengthen this at home by encouraging your child to participate in the 50 Super Science things to do before you're  $11\frac{3}{4}$ . Take a look at the Science section of the website if you haven't already as this has all the details of the activities you can do. When a challenge has been completed, please bring your child's evidence into school to share with the class teacher or email a photo through to the office. Certificates are awarded for every 10 challenges completed.

Over the past few weeks I have been reviewing the way in which children enter school in the morning and what happens at the beginning of the school day. From next Monday,  $21^{st}$  May, there will be a few changes as follows. Children may enter the school site as usual from 8:40am. Then, instead of lining up on the playground, the classroom doors will open at 8:45am and your child can enter the classroom then, through the classroom door. There will be an adult to greet them. The morning is a busy time, so please refrain from entering the classroom with your child as any messages can be passed on, if needed, via the adult at the door. At 8:55am the classroom doors will close and the register will be taken before 9:00am. If your child arrives after this time, please enter the school via the main entrance and your child will be recoded as late. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

Reception - walk through the side gate for Nursery and then enter via your classroom door.

Yrs 1 & 2 and 3 & 4 - enter your classroom door at the front of the school.

Yrs 5 & 6 - walk around the hall and then enter via your classroom door.



There has been an update regarding the status of Twyford C of E School becoming an Academy. Please read the attached letter from Russell Wood our Chair of Governors, outlining the changes and the decisions made.

After the half-term break if you are intending on taking your child out of school during term time, you will now need to complete a 'Request for Leave of Absence' Form. These are available from the school office. This will help us keep formal records of absences that are required.



Dear Parents,

It is important to advise you on the status of the school in its move to become an academy.

As you are aware we completed our operational due diligence and consultation period last year and decided to proceed to join the newly forming multi-academy trust - ODBST (Oxford Diocese Bucks School Trust).

The DfE gave their approvals and we started to look more into the detailed financial transition to look to set a sensible go live date that would not over burden the school office resources.

It was at this point that the initial guidance we had been provided with, namely that the move would be cost neutral for the school started to cause concern. We deferred our go live date whilst we reviewed the costings in more depth.

It was equally important for our new headteacher to also become involved and review all the findings in light of how she may wish to structure the school in the future and any implications this would impose.

At the same time it became clear that both the political landscape regarding academies and the concern around the level of support and costs from Bucks County Council had changed. The Government is no longer pursuing a directive that all schools must become academies. In fact, it seems that the latest advice is that to obtain approval, you have to prove that in doing so it will add value to the outcomes of pupils in the school.

Costs of Bucks County Council services have been refined to assist the smaller schools like Twyford.

As a result of our detailed financial due diligence, it is unfortunately clear that it would cost the school significantly more annually to become an academy either with ODBST or indeed any other MAT. It seems that this concern is also borne out by recent articles in the national press which indicates that 80% of academies now have some level of financial deficit. Please note, Twyford School's present financial position is robust, under control and in the black.

Therefore the Governors took the decision to withdraw from the move to become an academy in the governing body meeting of 8th May. We have informed ODBST & BCC accordingly.

To be absolutely clear, ODBST have not done anything wrong, their values and passion are not in question and we will aim to keep in contact with them in case the strategic landscape changes. If that central government pressure or local authority support does change, we know where to revisit and we do not believe ODBST would rebuff our advances.
