Year Three/Four	The Tale of a Flying Mouse by Torben Kuhlmann A clever, little mouse finds himself in a very bleak, quite worrying place, but... a brilliant idea, strong-will, perseverance and a whole heap of courage allows him to achieve his dream...
Year Five/Six	Neil Armstrong How did he work up to being in his position to change the world in the way he did? How can each of us change the world...?
