Dear Parents and Carers,

I would like to give a warm welcome back to you all following the half-term break. As we move further into the autumn term and the weather cools, please can you send your child to school with a warm coat as well as a hat and gloves if needed.

### **Staffing Updates**

Firstly, I would like to share with you the exciting news that Miss Morris is getting married this weekend. When returning to work on Monday, she will be Mrs Taylor! I am sure you will join with me in wishing both her and her fiancé all the best for their wedding day.

On 9<sup>th</sup> December Mrs Rumble will be returning to work from her maternity leave. Before the Christmas holidays, Mrs Rumble will be teaching in classes across the school before rejoining our Early Years team in January as a reception class teacher alongside Mrs Butcher. Mrs Rumble will be teaching the class on a Monday and Tuesday with Mrs Butcher teaching on a Wednesday to Friday.

At the end of this term we will be sadly saying goodbye to Mrs Kerr, our SENDCo, as she leaves us to increase the days she works in another school. I would like to thank her for the tireless work she has done at Twyford during her time with us, ensuring that the provision we have in place for our children with SEND is of the highest quality. I wish her every success and all the best for the future. We are currently exploring several options moving forward and will update you with further information when we can.

#### Charity Support 2024- 2025

In assembly on Monday I introduced our children to the charity we will be supporting this year as a school, explaining what the charity is and the work they do. **Akwaaba Volunteers** is an amazing charity based in Ghana who run several projects to help children and families living in Accra. Their vision statement is 'Brightening the future of the next generation'. This is how Jordan Palmer-Boeteng and King Boeteng, who co-founded the charity, describe the work they do:

The aim of Akwaaba volunteers in Ghana is to make a long-term positive change to communities and the lives of disadvantaged children. This is done by using our projects in education, health and sports to end the cycle of poverty and create opportunities for young people.

There are over 60,000 children living on the streets of Accra and one quarter of students in Ghana never complete primary school. We aim to change this by providing education for the most marginalised children, ensuring there are no barriers to education and giving children a safe place to learn, dream and play.

We believe every child has the right to education and our vision is to make sure that every child who is part of our projects is enrolled in full time education and has health insurance supported by Akwaaba Volunteers.

As a school we are hoping to raise funds in order to support three children to access education. The cost to ensure a child can attend school (including transport, food, equipment, uniform, etc) is only £250 for a year. Akwaaba Volunteers have identified three children who would really benefit from our support:



I will be travelling to Ghana over February half-term and teaching in the school there, meeting the children and getting to see first-hand the work of the charity in the community.

Our children have really got excited about the possibility of what we can do to help. In house assemblies this week, they have begun to think of fundraising activities they can organise to help reach our target of £750 and we will have more news about this shortly. In the meantime, if you want to find out more about the charity you can look on their website <a href="here">here</a> or follow them on social media sites. Additionally, if you wanted to make a donation towards our target, you can send it into school and mark it for Akwaaba Volunteers.

During the year, I will provide regular updates about the charity as well as let you know how well we are doing with our fundraising progress. If you have any questions or want to know more about how you can help and get involved, please get in touch.

### **School Disco**

It was wonderful to see so many of our children enjoying the disco last night. It is always a popular event and this year did not disappoint. I am told that one of the highlights for the children was when Mrs Hood and myself got completely covered in toilet roll! — if you are curious about this, ask your child who I am sure will tell you all about it! As always, I am thankful to those who volunteered to help and make sure the disco ran smoothly and was a success.

#### FOTS update and a plea for help

Towards the end of the summer term I let you know that a new committee was not formed during the FOTS AGM and therefore at the moment we do not have an active PTA in school. However, with the support of parents, we are still planning on running some popular events and fundraisers this term including the disco which took place on Thursday. We will also be holding the annual Christmas colour hamper raffle, organising Christmas gifts and party boxes as well as making the Christmas lunch a little bit extra special. In order for us to do these things, we will be asking for some help whether that be wrapping presents, selling raffle tickets, helping set up lunch or pour drinks. If you are able to give a little bit of your time to help, please get in touch and let us know what you can help with and when. Thank you.

We plan to hold a meeting in mid-January, during which we will try and form a new FOTS committee so that events and activities will continue for the children as well as providing support for the school. Please consider if this is something you can help with – it really does not take up too much time. If you want any further information, come and see me for a chat. Unless we can get a new committee, I am concerned that the PTA will completely fold and it would be very sad to see this happen.

### **Reading Awards**

There was much excitement this morning in our celebration assembly as we handed out our first Bronze Reading Awards of the year to children who have read a book to an adult at home for a total of 50 days. At the beginning of the year, we discussed with the children the importance of practising their reading to develop fluency and were

thrilled that a record-breaking 23 children achieved this award so soon. We continue to hand out Reading Awards weekly in our Friday assembly and I hope that many more children will receive theirs before the end of term.

### **Reception Starters September 2025**

We have been welcoming people to our school by giving personal tours to parents whose children are due to start school in September 2025. It is so lovely to share our wonderful school with people. If you know of anyone whose child is due to begin Reception next year please ask them to get in touch, we would love to meet them and show them around.

### Penalty Notices for School Attendance

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following will come into force for absences that start after 19th August 2024. This is nationwide and across borders if you move school or house. Term Time Leave is only allowed in exceptional circumstances when communicated in advance with evidence provided as soon as possible to the Headteacher.

#### FIRST OFFENCE

£150 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days and reduced to £100 per parent, per child if paid with 21 days

#### SECOND OFFENCE

PLEASE ENSURE YOU COMMUNICATE WITH YOUR CHILD'S SCHOOL

in law only the headteacher of a school can authorise a child's absence. A pupil's attendance forms part of their official school record

Parents do not have an automatic right to remove their child from school during term time for the purpose of a leave of absence and are strongly advised not to do so

Headteachers are unable to authorise leave of absence during term time niess they are satisfied that there are exceptional circumstances.

The fundamental principles for defining 'exceptional' are rare, significant, unavoidable and short, 'Unavoidable' implies that an event could not reasonably be scheduled at another time.
